Council's Decision on The Glasshouse

Like it or otherwise it seems we are stuck with it. Council undertook a detailed review of the Glasshouse Business Plan in 2010. The two key questions that drove the review were: Who is best placed to own the building? & Who is best placed to run the business? The seven options considered were:

- 1. Glasshouse owned and operated by Council
- 2. Glasshouse owned by Council with revised corporate structure
- 3. Glasshouse owned by Council with business closed and building mothballed
- 4. Glasshouse owned by Council but leased for alternative business
- 5. Glasshouse owned by Council with business run by contracted manager
- 6. Complete exit from the business and sale of the building
- 7. Sale and lease back

Options 2 to 7 were not considered viable for several reasons including lack of a better financial outcome.

- . Loss of community benefit in case of complete exit
- Substantial losses in case of sale with estimated value of \$18 million against the cost of \$50 million (of which \$39 million is still owing).

The agreed option is for Council to own and operate the Glasshouse with associated costs of (\$6.3) million. Made up of:

•	Borrowing costs (Interest)	(\$2.230)	million
•	Repayment of loans	(\$1.366)	"
•	Operating costs (after receipts)	(<u>\$2.700</u>)	"
•	TOTAL	(\$6.296)	"

This Business Plan was adopted at Council's December 2010 meeting. To overcome the debt issue the previous Administrator passed a resolution to use funds from the sale of Council owned land at Thrumster to payout the debt. This would eliminate the interest and loan repayments leaving an annual loss of \$2.7 million..

Let's hope those Councillors who voted to burden Ratepayers with the Glasshouse do not stand for election in 2012.

\$1 Million Federal funding for Lake Innes reversion is great news

Federal Member for Lyne, Rob Oakeshott, has announced \$1million has been allocated in the Federal Budget towards planning and works to revert Lake Innes to fresh water.

Mr. Oakeshott said "The \$1million for Lake Innes will support work to revert the Lake to its natural and original freshwater state which would increase freshwater habitat on the Mid North Coast from 40 hectares to more than 700 hectares".

In addition to the above studies already done reveal:

- "The isolation of Lake Innes (from the estuary) will increase the number of entrance openings from average one per year to three".
- "When Lake Innes fills any further rainfall would flow into the lower estuary & Lake Cathie increasing water depth & flow rates".
- "More frequent openings would result in a narrower channel and reduce the erosion to the southern headland".
- "The need to dredge the lower estuary would be reduced".

There is a narrow and closing window of opportunity before Lake Innes declines permanently to the status of a salt marsh.

More importantly reversion of Lake Innes creates a habitat for fresh water birds, frogs, and turtles. It also provides a future venue for fresh water fishing. The environment and tourism will be big winners and residents will get more entrance openings.

The first stage of reversion is to undertake an Environmental Impact Statement from which a plan of works can be developed.

LCPA meet with Council's Acting General Manager

The Association's Executive met with Mr. Jeffrey Sharp, Council's Acting GM in late March. Recommendations from the Lake Cathie Master Plan were discussed. Priorities being:

- Storm water outlets along the beach
- Footpaths & pedestrian safety
- Need for additional sports fields
- Estuary issues in particular west of the Bridge
- Timing for upgrades of Ocean Drive (through the village) and Houston Mitchell Drive

The Executive congratulated Mr. Sharp for actions by Council in fixing the unsafe sloping footpath and for commencing drainage works to overcome flooding of Fiona Crescent properties.

Beware of Mosquito borne diseases

NSW Health has warned residents & visitors in rural & coastal areas to cover up and avoid mosquito bites especially in the months of April and May. The risk of Barmah Forest infection this year is said to be three times that of normal.

Ross River and Barmah Forest Virus infections are carried by mosquitoes which have bitten birdlife, kangaroos or other wildlife contracting the diseases and then biting humans passing on the infection.

As yet there is no specific treatment for these viruses.

Recommended precautions include:

- Avoid being outside unprotected at dusk & dawn
- Avoid high risk breeding sites such as marsh areas
- Apply insect repellant containing DEET or Picaridin.
- Ensure there are no pools of water around the home e.g. old car tyres, undrained plant pots etc.
- Check water tanks are screened & filters clean

Missing link in Ocean Dr cycle lanes creates road safety issues



Cyclist changes from cycle lane to traffic lane in 100 kmh zone

Cycle ways in the 100 kmh section of Ocean Drive north of the village are not continuous with about 1300 metres where cycle lanes are not provided.

This results in motorists having to slow down considerably when a cyclist moves into the traffic lane. The risks to cyclists & motorists seem unnecessary. Cyclists have supported the Association's action in seeking continuous cycle lanes.

The problem is greater over the weekend and a couple of weeks prior to the Ironman when more cyclists use the road.

Council has stated the eastern side of the road is impacted by environmental issues and it is negotiating with Essential Energy to move power poles on the western side.

Where did that name come from? Solander Place

Dr Daniel Solander was born in Sweden in 1736 where he studied and became a botanist. He moved to England where he became Assistant Librarian at the British Museum and afterwards became Keeper of Printed Books.

Doesn't sound too much of an interesting chap so far does he?

Well he then travelled with Captain James Cook and Joseph Banks on the Endeavour on its expedition to the Pacific. They arrived at Botany Bay in April 1770 where they spent eight days collecting plant species. A botanical artist who travelled with them made magnificent field drawings and watercolours of the specimens collected.

So why a 1770 plant collector is called Solander remembered today?

The need to take extraordinary care of the plant drawings led to the good Doctor designing a box which is still today called the "SOLANDER BOX". The design is used worldwide in Art Galleries, Museums and Libraries and is usually made with acid free materials for long term storage of valuable works on paper and other collections.

The new vehicle features accessories not seen on older models including:

- Four sets of breathing apparatus (previously two) meaning they can enter burning homes or other buildings without waiting for back-up.
- Addition lights to illuminate surrounding areas.
- Higher capacity water pump.
- Additional storage areas.

The Lake Cathie Fire Service caters for urban fires in the village and Bonny Hills with their upgraded fleet.
