UPDATES from PMHC:

• LAKE DREDGING

You will note that Dredging commenced at the lake on Monday 21st May and is expected to take several weeks to complete. The initial dredging is replenishing the sand along the Foreshore to replace all that was destroyed and washed away with high seas when the lake was open.

FORESHORE MASTERPLAN

Council have now advised, due to changes adopted by State Environmental Planning Policy {SEPP} (Coastal Management 2018) a review of Environmental Factors is required for construction in areas identified as Coastal Wetland & Littoral Rainforest Areas. This means the majority of the Masterplan improvements are identified under legislation and will therefore require a DA. The LCPA will continue to monitor this process and notify the community as and when changes are made.

• ROUND 2 GRANT SUBMISSIONS

LCPA applied to PMHC as part of Community Grants, Round 2 for funds to upgrade our current Webpage/Facebook. This is the first time in many years LCPA have requested a grant for improvement of communication to the community and residents of Lake Cathie. Unfortunately our application was not successful, so it's back to the drawing board to raise funds and increase our capital to have this work undertaken.

• MEETING WITH MAYOR

As advised in our April newsletter the LCPA Executive met with Mayor Pinson and items discussed were, Lake Dredging and Opening Strategy, Foreshore Master Plan, Ocean Drive upgrade and Traffic Counts.

- *-Council voted to not change the existing Lake Opening Policy at their April meeting.
- *-LCPA were advised on the 15th May that Council had not yet received the data back from the consultant regarding the Traffic Counts, but would forward it to us as soon as received.
- *-Detailed Design Works north of Miala Street to Orana Drive PMHC advised "Unfortunately the concept design has been delayed due to a requirement to investigate a staged approach to the construction works. The revised completion date of the design drawings will be the 15th June 2018 at which time community engagement will commence".

• FISHING PLATFORM

As residents will now see the new footpath from the Fishing Platform to the toilet block has been completed, however we are still waiting for PMHC to complete the new Fish Cleaning Table that was part of the original design plan. The design for the table is to have drainage for fish waste as well as water connection. LCPA will continue to follow up to ensure the table is installed and connected.

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Albert & Ruth Johnston

The LCPA would like to congratulate Albert and Ruth Johnston, as well as their family and friends who arranged to have a bench installed into the park at the Community Hall in Alberts honor. As reported in our local paper, Albert was the instigator who undertook the removal and beautification of this area of parkland. In addition to this both Albert and Ruth managed the community hall on behalf of the PMHC for many many years and it is due to their tireless work that our community hall is much utilized today. CONGRATULATIONS TO LAKE CATHIE MEDICAL CENTRE

DA THROUGH FOR STAGE 4 OF THE HEALTH COMPLEX

It has taken a while but we finally have our DA approved for Stage 4 of the Health Complex. This next stage will see a stand-alone Allied Health hub providing a state of the art facility to house a Hydrotherapy Pool, Physiotherapy Practice and Rehab Centre.

Barry, Sarah & Ashleigh from the Physio Department are fully subscribed and have run out of room to increase their services. By providing additional rooms and resources, the Allied Health Hub will provide a multi-disciplinary rehabilitation service allowing for increased numbers of Physiotherapists as well as expanding Allied Health services to eventually include Occupational Therapists and Exercise Physiologists. We are also super excited about the additional of an indoor heated pool for use by our Allied Health team. Hydrotherapy is so beneficial for people that are preparing for, or recovering from, joint replacements as well as those that suffer from arthritis. Our aim is to also open up the pool to the wider community for activities such as arthritis classes, balance & mobility classes and social aqua aerobics classes – all year round.

The additional floor space within the Allied Health Hub will allow the Physio's to expand Falls Prevention Programs, Stepping On Programs & Pilates classes – this will not only increase our patients health and well-being, but help to educate on the importance of prevention.

We are now busy getting engineering reports done ready to put project out to Tender. We are hopeful we may see construction start around October/November and are expecting completion date around July next year.
