THE LAKE CATHIE FIRE 22[™] JANUARY 2002

Incident #387

The fire started just south of Port Macquarie Golf Club in tinder dry conditions with a strong northerly blowing and put the entire Cathie village under threat. After many hours of hard work the fire was stopped at the sports field just before it got to the houses

The fire fighting is best described in the verse below penned by *Graham Miller* one of the volunteer fire fighters.

It was 10.27 when the pagers went off, "Lake Cathie, Bush alight, Ocean Drive." Well it started at Port, just south of Bells track, And we stopped it near Cathie around five.

We put a back-burn in at the Perch Hole, But the fire, it just came too fast, So we pulled back to Cathie and lit her again, And this one, well it had to last.

From the top of our trucks, we could see them,
The flames must be 50 foot high,
As the chopper did swoop with its bucket,
The koalas looked on with a sigh.

I don't remember my thoughts when the front hit,
But we stood there coz this was our ground,
With the hoses a gushin, adrenalin too,
And Lake Cathie remains safe and sound.
Since that day we've had all the locals,
Call us heroes and shakin our hand,
Was a six year old boy said, "Hey you saved our lives",
As I smiled and looked at the sand.

Down the street a girl said, "Mum that's our fireman", I kept walkin; she waved for a while. It feels good when you know that you're appreciated, And it helps when you're showed with a smile.

But a new shed is our dream
Before the old one falls down or just bursts coz there's too much inside.
So help us with that and we'll just call it square,

And those against it can go away and hide.

Well they got their new shed in October 2004 and this year a brand new state of the art fire truck.

Lake Cathie Coastline Management Study

The following is an update supplied to LCPA by Council on the current status of the Study.

Council adopted Stage 1 of the Management Study in December 2009 and endorsed the need for further examination of four viable options. These are:

- 400 metre Revetment protection for Illaroo Road
- Groin
- Beach Nourishment
- Planned retreat including acquisition/voluntary purchase

The analyses of each option include issues such as Economic, Ecological, Social Impacts, Amenity Impacts e.g. the beach and Draft Planning Controls.

The Stage 2 Management Study will also reflect NSW Government Sea Level Rise Policy and Coastal Risk Management Guideline.

Current Status

Council expects a draft report on the Study to be available for public exhibition in October 2011.

During the exhibition period Council plans to hold a Community Information Day (probably at LC Community Hall) to present/discuss recommendations of Stage 2 of the Study.

Bus stop safety issues resolved

The safety of school children crossing Ocean Drive at Abel Tasman Dr. is to be resolved with the southbound bus stop being re-located opposite the Medical Centre.

This issue has been an LCPA priority for many years. In 2010 the speed was reduced from 80 to 70KMH and the current relocation with a safety refuge in the centre of the road is a welcome addition.

We understand relocation of the northbound bus stop could follow with a footpath from the Medical Centre to Abel Tasman also a possibility.

LCPA meets with local MP

Executive members of the Association met with local Member Leslie Williams MP in late June outlining some of the high priority recommendations of the Village Master Plan. Among the issues raised were:

- Estuary dredging east & west of Ocean Dr Bridge
- Future use of Education land in Lake Cathie
- Maintenance/walking track through Chepana Reserve
- Additional sports field
- Future NSW Govt. Grant opportunities

Leslie will investigate and respond to the Association in the near future.

Meeting called to form Tidy Towns Group

A meeting to set up Lake Cathie Tidy Towns Group will be held at the LC Community Hall on Sunday August 21 at 10.30AM.

The purpose of the meeting is to reach agreement that the formation of the group has sufficient community support to be successful and if so to agree that a Working Group be formed to establish local a Tidy Towns operation.

If the group is formed it will operate as a sub-committee of Lake Cathie Landcare Group Inc. for insurance purposes and to fit within Fair Trading rules for incorporated bodies.


Mobile phone reception on the way

Dredging funding

Member for Port Macquarie, Leslie Williams MP, has confirmed that part of the promised \$1.5 million funding for dredging projects across the State will be made available to our Council for dredging works at Lake Cathie.

The Association has had a number of questions from residents as to when the heavily silted lagoon will be dredged.

Council has indicated it wishes to link the dredging with the option of pumping the sand onto the beach south of the entrance. This is one of the options included in the Lake Cathie Coastal Management Plan due for public exhibition in early October – see story on page one.

This seems sensible and will avoid duplication of costs.

No dredging west of Ocean Dr Bridge

One recommendation from the Estuary Management Committee Minutes to Council's meeting on July 27 is:

d) Dredging of tidal flushing channels:

That no dredging works be undertaken between the Ocean Drive Bridge and the Kenwood Drive Bridge. That dredging works be limited to removal of sediment from the entrance downstream of the Ocean Drive bridge.

This recommendation was strongly opposed by Lake Cathie's two representatives on the Estuary Management Committee.

The need for clearing of the channels west of the Ocean Drive Bridge has been well reported with navigation becoming more restricted as the estuary continues to shallow.

Another recommendation to go the Council meeting is:

a) Kenwood Drive bridge

That Kenwood Drive Bridge be widened as part of any future asset upgrade or replacement works.

Future fish kills possible

A common cause of Fish Kills is when shallow water is heated during high summer temperatures to the level where dissolved oxygen is reduced to a point that fish cannot survive.

This last fish kill occurred in the estuary in early 2009 and the reducing water depth invites a repeat of the problem.

There is a view that fish kills are common in estuaries such as Cathie. However where they are predictable and preventable it should not be allowed to occur. Dredging of the area west of the bridge is necessary to prevent a repeat of 2009.
